

Mark Riel donated connecting theater seats from Pittsfield's Scenic Theatre. Just looking at them brings back memories—not only of the Scenic Theatre, but of other theaters. They are the classic red leather, with metal frames. Thanks, Mark!

2022 Calendar—Dedicated to Pittsfield's Men and Women—Who Served in the Military

Honoring the men and women of Pittsfield who have served in the Armed Forces across more than a century is the theme of the Pittsfield Historical Society's 2022 calendar. It depicts the soldiers who fought for their country, beginning with Asa Bartlett, a captain in the Civil War; the Gold Star Mothers who lost a son or daughter while in combat; and dedication ceremonies for the memorials that have been erected throughout the town. Although there were soldiers from Pittsfield who fought in the Revolutionary War, the Historical Society was unable to find pictures.

The Dollhouse Has Come Home!

For numerous years, an exquisite 1700s colonial-style dollhouse has been on display at the Epsom Library. This detailed dollhouse was built by Ralph Van Horn. Although he originally hadn't planned on making a dollhouse, he loved crafts and was fond of the historical buildings in Portsmouth. So, for three decades, he spent his free time constructing dollhouse furniture from 1:12-inch scale kits. He gave this furniture to his daughter, Christina Van Horn, who determined that the best way to showcase this fine furniture was to construct an open -sided dollhouse. With her husband, Dana Milner, they created a four-story miniature house that is historically accurate.

Ms. Van Horn said the dollhouse was a family affair. The furniture was made by her father; some of the pillows were crafted by her grandmother. Some of the furniture found in the attic does not match the time period, but they were pieces given to her over the years.

Currently the dollhouse's furnishings are packed away for safety, but they will be placed in the appropriate rooms when the dollhouse is put on display. The pictures shown were taken when the dollhouse was on display at the Epsom Library.

Pittsfield's Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican War, and Spanish-American War Veterans by Larry Berkson (2006).

This book describes the Pittsfield veterans who served in the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican War, and Spanish-American War. Presented are major biographies about John Cram and Jonathan "Jocky" Fogg, as well as more than 65 other individuals who served in the Revolutionary War, nearly 50 who served in the War of 1812, two who served in the Mexican War, nine who served in the Spanish-American War, and nearly 30 others associated with Pittsfield. It also contains 62 photographs of headstones and places where the veterans lived.

Pittsfield's World War II Veterans, Volume 1, Army Veterans: The American and Northern European Theaters

A book on Pittsfield's World War II army veterans who served in the American and Northern European Theaters. Included are 35 biographies of men serving in the United States during the war, and 72 men who served in Northern Europe, as well as 105 photographs.

A 168-page book on Pittsfield's World II Army Air Corps veterans. Included are biographies of 19 men who served in the United States, six who served in Europe and Africa, and 16 who served in the Pacific, as well as 44 photographs.

Included are biographies of two men who served in the Coast guard, 19 who served in the Marines, three who served in the Merchant Marines, and 50 who served in the Navy, as well as 67 photographs.

Pittsfield's World War II Veterans, Volume V, Female Veterans and Veterans Loosely Associated with Pittsfield

by Larry Berkson and Robert Moulton (2010).

A 252-page book on those women, either closely associated or loosely associated with Pittsfield, who served in World War II. It also includes male veterans loosely connected with Pittsfield. A final section is devoted to a summary of birth dates, educational levels, dates of entry, ranks and ratings, combat medals awarded, those killed or wounded, prisoners of war, and mortality of Pittsfield's veterans. Also included are 50 photographs.
